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Pastor's Reflections Sacred Places

One of my favorite artists is Vincent Van Gogh who often painted places that for him were sacred and holy. He wrote about nature. "All nature seems to speak . . . as for me, I cannot understand why everybody does not see it or feel it; nature or God does it for everyone who has eyes and ears and a heart to understand."

We meet God in many places and spaces. Wherever we meet God is sacred and holy. Where do you meet God? Recently I asked some people this question and here are some of the holy places and sacred spaces where they meet God.

- † In the hospital where I meet people who share their faith
- † In the presence of an elderly person who is stalwart and courageous
- † At Ocean Park I see the water and waves and know God is there.
- † A small child opened the church and welcomed me. I met God in that young one.
- † In the Canadian sunsets I see the artist God.
- † Walking in the woods and working in flower and vegetable beds I know God is with me.
- † When I hear music.
- † While sitting in the cemetery and remembering loved ones.
- † When I visit Holy Ruins, I connect with the saints and with God.

In these places and in our own holy spaces we can approach God and even talk to God. Marcus Borg in his book *The Heart of Christianity* calls these places thin places. Thin places are where the "visible world of our ordinary experience and God, the sacred Spirit, meet and intersect. They are places where the boundary between the ordinary and the sacred becomes very soft, porous and permeable. Thin places are where the veil momentarily lifts and we behold God, experience the one in whom we live, all around us."

A sacred place can be one special place or it can be many. The sacred and holy can be with us wherever we are –in many places and spaces. Our church has many sacred places. Of course we experience God's presence as we gather in our sanctuary on Sunday morning. We also have a beautiful camp and a renewed chapel where we can connect with God.

I love going to our camp and sitting by the water or walking on the new meditation trail that starts near our worship area and goes along the water. I like to stop and sit on a rock and look at Lake Maranacook, listen for the loons and watch them play on the water. Our camp is a wonderful place to experience the wonder of our Creator. For me our camp is a sacred place – a thin place where I can meet God and experience the wonder of creation.

I also look forward to times of mediation and prayer in our newly restored and renewed chapel. The light and colors of the room bring me into a calming and peaceful presence of God.

A special thanks to all who have worked hard so we can have two new and beautiful sacred spaces where we can experience the love and power of God.

May these holy places, where we speak to God and where God speaks to us; where God recreates us and sends us to love as Jesus' and the Father's love transform us.

WOMEN'S GUILD NOTES

The Women's Guild is a social group with a mission. Membership is open to all women of the church. We usually meet once a month, on the fourth Thursday, at member's homes or at church.

We support the needs of the church by coordinating altar flowers for worship, by purchasing paper goods for the church, by sending cards and caring notes to people in need. We also coordinate receptions for funerals and special occasions. During the winter, hats & mittens are collected for area school children; Prayer shawls are made with love, Material Aid Kits (school, health & clean-up) are assembled for the Church World Service program. We sponsor a child named Hussam from Jerusalem. Most of our funds are raised through our sales of RADA cutlery and Sangamon Mills dishcloths, which are available at our chowder luncheons and church fairs.

Speaking of RADA Cutlery, we recently discovered that RADA offers dishwasher safe handles! Cyndi has just placed an order for popular items with the **new** handles, but we need to make room for the new items.

So, the Women's Guild will have a HOT SALE on items in our current inventory. The sale of **20-40% off the retail price** will be **available to our church family after church worship** on **October 16th & 23rd**. Be sure to stop by the table then to catch some wonderful deals! The sale price won't last long.

At our September meeting, we donated \$100 towards the Honduras project goal of \$3500, and we hope that this donation will spur others to donate as well. The Honduras Mission Trip Planning committee is interested in fundraiser ideas and people to help coordinate the events-Fiesta Public Supper, Dessert Social, Mini-Golf tournament. Any willing hands out there?

From the Treasurer

As of the end of August, income was \$1626 less than the budget. Actual income was \$51,239 compared to the budget of \$52,865. The difference is primarily attributed to offerings.

Expenses for the same period were \$2637 more than budget. Actual expenses were \$56,020 compared to the budget of \$53,383. The difference is primarily attributed to fuel oil.

Hannaford Gift Card Sales

As of September 18, Hannaford gift cards sales have totaled \$16,275, bringing earnings for the church of \$775.

Starting in September, our Board has had a plate full of projects for the fall and early winter months. In December, BCCC is responsible for the Domestic Violence project where our church provides much-appreciated support to a family for the Christmas holiday. The Augusta chapter assigns us a family that needs our support and assistance. Our church has been very supportive of this project in the past and we are sure the same will hold true for this coming season. Our thanks to all of you for your past help; we can "count ourselves blessed".

Rev. Saul Barahona Guifarro's sermon as given to Winthrop Congregational Church on Sunday, September 25, 2011- translation by Peter Coulton

EL TEMOR DE JEHOVA. THE FEAR OF THE LORD PROVERBIOS 1:7

El mundo tiene urgencia de hombres y mujeres que actuen con sabiduria, los proverbios fueron escritos, con el proposito de desarrollar sabiduria. The world has urgent need of men and women acting with wisdom. Proverbs was written with the purpose of developing wisdom.

Salomon nos dice, que no es posible alcanzar lo que nos proponemos, sin una comprension correcta de Dios.

Solomon says to us, that it is not possible to achieve what we want, without a proper understanding of God.

- Temer no significa: "tener miedo de" mas bien un temor reverencial a Dios, sentir un respeto total ante El, ser realista en cuanto su poder.
- Fear does not mean: 'be afraid of ' rather a reverential fear of God, a feeling of respect towards Him, being realistic insofar as his power.
- -Principio: es el primer paso, O punto de partida en la senda que tomamos, para alcanzar un destino determinado.
- To begin: it is the first step, a starting point on the footpath that we take, to reach a certain destination.
- -Sabiduria : es el intento por comprender loque nos rodea.
- Wisdom: It is the attempt to understand what surrounds us

Salomon reline estos tres terrninos, para informarnos, que la idea que tengamos de Dios depende de nuestra concepcion razonable que nace de un corazon integro hacia EL. El mundo tiene sus propias caracteristicas en cuanto al tern or por ejemplo: alguien puede tener temor de la oscuridad, la altura, a estar encerrado etc. Pero el temor que menciona el escritor biblico, viene a ser beneficioso a aquel que lo practica.

Solomon lists three terms, to inform us, that the idea we have of God depends upon our reasonable conception that is born from a heart fully integrated with HIM. Our world has its own characteristics in terms of fear. For example, someone may be afraid of darkness, height, etc., or to be enclosed in small spaces. But the fear that the Biblical writer mentions, becomes beneficial to one who practices it.
